Neighborhood Block Parties

Each year, neighborhood "Block Captains" organize block parties featuring cookouts, live music, and entertainment provided by neighborhood residents with the help of sponsoring Cheyenne businesses, churches, and specialty groups.









Party Planning

- Parties can be what you want them to be large or small gatherings.
- Cheyenne Police Department units will be in attendance.
- CPD assists with
 - Permits to host the party
 - Water donations
 - Trash pick-up
 - Road closures/barricades
 - T-shirts, aprons, tote bags



Permit Process


- New online permit process
 - www.cheyennepd.org/CNN
 - Scroll to the "Online Permit Application" link
 - Make sure it is filled out entirely.
 - The fee is waived.
 - You are also expected to provide a sketch of the block party and any streets involved and attach it to the forms.

Deadline to submit form is Monday, June 16



Barricades/Street Closures

- Indicate if you need roads closed in your neighborhood.
- Include a sketch/Google Map drawing of where you would like barricades placed.
- Community Service Officers (CSOs) will reach out to Block Captains to coordinate barricade drop-off.
- The barricades can be set up an hour before the block party begins and must be taken down when the party concludes.
- The CSOs will come to pick them up the following day.



Trash Pick-up

- If your regular pick-up is on Friday:
 - Place any extra bags of trash at the Block Captain's address/preferred address.
 - The city will send orders for the trash drivers to pick them up.
- If your regular pick-up is Monday Thursday.
 - Call the City by noon on July 12th to schedule an extra pick-up.
 - If you use multiple containers, be sure to share how many will be out on the curb when you call.
- If you are hosting a large party and need a bin dropped off, call the Sanitation Division.


The Day Before...
